Statement of Purpose:

This agreement has been entered into by Lac Courte Oreilles Ojibwa Community College and The College of St. Scholastica. The purpose of this agreement is to facilitate credit transfer and provide a smooth transition from one related degree program to another. It is further recognized that the attached appendix or appendices shall describe the program of study at Lac Courte Oreilles Ojibwa Community College required for admission eligibility to The College of St. Scholastica in the Social Work Program. This agreement identifies all required and equivalent courses at each institution.

Terms and Conditions of Credit Transfer:

Transfer students will be held to the same standards and criteria for admission to a major degree sequence as are The College of St. Scholastica students.

Requirements that must be completed before attending The College of St. Scholastica to implement this agreement:

• Associate of Arts degree in Human Services

Applicants accepted must fulfill the graduation requirements of the granting institution as identified in **Appendix A**.

Articulation Implementation and Agreement Review

The Chief Academic Officer or designee of each collaborating institution shall be responsible for implementing this agreement, for identifying and incorporating any changes into subsequent agreements, and for conducting a periodic review of this agreement.

Lac Courte Oreilles Ojibwa Community College is responsible for updating The College of St. Scholastica of any curriculum changes to ensure the continuation of this agreement. The faculty and appropriate administrators from each institution will meet at least once every two years or as necessary to assess all aspects of this agreement. The outcome will be the continuation of or changes to the Articulation Agreement, curriculum, and /or degree plans as necessary.

This agreement becomes effective on May 1, 2019 and remains in effect for three years and then re-evaluated or until terminated or amended by either party with prior written notice.

APPENDIX A

Memorandum of Cooperation between Lac Courte Oreilles Ojibwa Community College and The College of St. Scholastica (CSS)

Transfer Articulation Agreement for Associate of Arts (A.A.) degree in Human Services. This agreement includes specific requirements for admission into a program, outlines requirements, and indicates which courses can be used to meet program prerequisites as well as general education, major and program, and graduation requirements.

Social Work

Admission Requirements for the Social Work Major at the College of St. Scholastica (CSS):

- Recommended 64 -74 credits
- 2.5 cumulative GPA
- 2.5 cumulative GPA in psychology, sociology, and social work courses preferred.
- Minimum of a "C" grade in all prerequisite courses.
- Application to Social Work major and acceptance into the program.

CSS Bachelor Degree Requirements:

The following minimum College requirements must be met for the bachelor's degree:

- 1. Satisfactorily complete a minimum of 128 semester credits including:
 - Forty-two upper-division credits (numbered 3000 or above).
 - A major program as stipulated by a department or advisor.
 - Achieve a minimum GPA of 2.0 in the major as well as an overall "C" average.
- 2. Fulfill the residence requirement:
 - The last 32 credits before graduation must be earned at The College of St. Scholastica.
 - A minimum of 16 credits must be earned in a major field at The College of St. Scholastica.
 - Cross-registered courses may count toward residence; CLEP and Portfolio Assessment credits must be earned before the final 32 credits.
- 3. Complete the general education requirements. Requirements for some majors are more stringent than these minimums.
- 4. The maximum number of physical education credits that can count toward graduation is 8.

The Veritas general education requirements for the B.A. degree include a mix of Conceptions courses (typically lower division 1000-2000 level) and Integrations courses (upper division 3000-4000 level). Integrations courses are intended to be writing intensive and must be completed at the College of St. Scholastica (CSS). Students may transfer in Conceptions level courses to fulfill many of the Veritas General Education areas; however, they must complete two Integrations courses (8 credits) at the CSS. The Social Work BA curriculum includes one Integrations course – SWK 3360. Students will need to complete an additional Integrations course at the CSS. One option would be to complete an Integrations Religious Studies course at CSS since there are no transfer options available to meet that Veritas General Education requirement.

Please note that students admitted as first-year students at the Duluth Campus must also complete the Dignitas requirement and the Language requirement unless otherwise exempt.
